
There is an option to visit Home Farm Cafe, on the National Trust Parke estate -see Parke Walled Garden on map.

## Best Buckfastleigh Walks




## Walk 1 Buckfastleigh (2.4 miles)



A very pleasant short walk to Buckfastleigh and the ruins of a church destroyed by fire. There is an option to see some cave entrances.


More Details & Walks


## Walk 1 Dartington Hall (3.4 miles)



A castle, pub and river walk combined through one of the most magical landscapes in Devon!





## Walk 1 Yellow Walk (1.8 miles)





Noone is quite sure about the origin of the name but more than likely beggars used to favour this section of the road to Plymouth.





This part of Haldon is still free from racing cyclists and is therefore much preferred by walkers.




This is a longer but most rewarding (pub) walk with a steady climb and a steep descent.






## Walk 2 Lustleigh to Packhorse Bridge (3 miles)



A very pleasant walk starting from the village and descending to the famous packhorse bridge.





## Walk 1 Newton Wood (4.5 miles)







## Walk 2 Circular Walk on East Hill (2.8 miles)






This walk follows the Taw , as above , then crosses the river to a car park returning via a country lane. Allow for at least an hour



### Walk 1 Stoke Woods (1.4 miles allow 1 hour)



This is a short but very pleasant walk to a view point which inspired Jane Austen to write Sense & Sensibility.


Some very old and tall trees are found in these woods (NW of Exeter) which during the Middle Ages provided valuable building timber.

to the river Teign.


Stover Country Park, once part of a large estate owned by James Templer, is an ideal centre for both long and short family walks.
